Go to www.nixle.com to receive community alerts via text message and email.

Get a NOAA Weather Radio. Receive immediate alerts.
Contact Ethnic Education Foundation for non-English radio stations.

PLAN FOR YOUR PETS

It's important to plan for your pets, too! Your pets are part of the family, and they will also need supplies in the event of a disaster. Local animal shelters will not be able to keep pets during an evacuation, so make sure you are prepared.

Make sure to keep extra supplies such as:

- Food in an airtight, waterproof container
- Clean containers for a 3-day supply of water (in addition to what you need for your family)
- Medicines and medical records
- Crate or pet carrier
- Sanitation supplies (litter box, plastic bags, paper towels, bleach, etc.)
- Favorite toys and treats
- Extra leash and collar
- Make sure your pet has an Identification Tag (in case of separation)

BE PREPARED FOR DISASTERS

BASICS CHECKLIST *FOR A COMPREHENSIVE LIST, VISIT REPMATSUMOTO.COM*

- REFERENCE MATERIAL (First Aid Book)
- WATER for at least two weeks (1 gallon per person per day)
- FOOD for at least two weeks (non-perishable, canned, emergency food pail)
- COOKING AND DINING SUPPLIES
- SUPPLIES FOR THOSE WITH SPECIAL NEEDS (infants & elderly)
- IMPORTANT DOCUMENTS (in a waterproof portable container)
- FULL TANK OF GAS
- MEETING PLACE FOR FAMILY
- MEDICATIONS
- FIRST AID KIT
- BATTERIES
- FLASHLIGHT
- BATTERY-OPERATED RADIO
- MATCHES / LIGHTERS
- TOOLS (non-electric can opener, utility knife, wrench, pliers, tape)
- SANITATION SUPPLIES (toilet paper, towels, disinfectant, soap)
- EXTRA CLOTHING
- RAIN GEAR
- PLASTIC SHEETING
- ENTERTAINMENT (books, activities for children)
- CASH (small bills - credit card systems may be down)
- SLEEPING BAG
