**\$5.3M**Leilehua High School: Plans, design, construction, and equipment for improvements to the stadium and football field; project scope to include the stadium field turf and synthetic track surface, restrooms, concession stands, and announcers booth; ground and site improvements; equipment appurtenances.

**\$2.5M** Leilehua High School: Design and construction to repave existing campus roads and driveway; ground and site improvements; equipment and appurtenances.

**Leilehua High School:** Plans, design, construction, and equipment for improvements to the stadium and football field; project scope to include the stadium field turf and synthetic track surface, restrooms, concession stands, and announcers booth; ground and site improvements; equipment appurtenances.

**\$650K** Mililani High School: Design and construction for girls athletic locker room.

**\$1.68M Mililani High School:** Design and construction for softball field improvements.





# **BILLS THAT PASSED IN THE**

### **EDUCATION**

Hawaii Keiki HB 250: Establishing Hawaii Keiki: Healthy and Ready to Learn Program. The pro-

gram enhances school-based health services with a partnership from the University

of Hawaii School of Nursing and Dental Hygiene and the DOE.

**Best Practices** HB 1276: Establishing Classroom Best Practices Working Group. The group will

design and develop best classroom practices to optimize student learning. Mem-

bers from DOE, government, and private educational

organizations.

Suicide Prevention **SB 383:** Suicide is the leading cause of injury related deaths for residents aged 15 to 24 years. The goal of this program is to create awareness for key indicators of

suicidal students so school personnel can intervene.

Preschool Education

**SB 78:** Establishes State-funded pre-kindergarten programs and private-partinerships funded pre-kindergarten programs in the public schools administered by the Executive Office of Early Learning.

### **HUMAN SERVICES & HOMELESSNESS**

Kupuna Caregiver Program **SB 1025:** Allows kupuna to remain in their own home longer by providing \$210 per week to caregivers for supplemental at-home services customized to the kupuna's needs.

**Ohana Zones** 

**HB 257:** Allows private lands to be used for hosting Ohana Zones and appropriates an additional \$2 million for the construction of shelters and other infrastructure necessary for assisting the homeless population.

Hope for the Homeless

**SB 471:** Provides core homelessness services, including outreach programs, rapid re-housing programs, Housing First program, family assessment centers, stored property and debris removal services, and the state rent supplemental program.

### **HEALTH & SAFETY**

Crosswalk Safety **SB 98:** Clarifies that a driver of a motor vehicle must stop for a pedestrian when any part of the pedestrian's body, wheelchair, cane, crutch, or bicycle is beyond the curb or the edges of the road or within an intersection or crosswalk.

**Nursing Facility Care** 

**HB 1449:** Helps low income individuals whose Medicaid payments do not cover the actual costs of care by extending the Nursing Facility Sustainability Program to 2021.

Mental Health Treatment **SB 1124:** Strengthens the Family Court's ability to order those with serious mental illness to undergo intensive psychiatric treatment through an assisted community treatment program.
