Constituents within the areas of Mililani, Mokulé'ia, Wheeler, Schofield, Kunia, and Waialua received a short survey that gauged how community members felt about certain topics including state vaccination mandates for school age children, the state's current response to the covid-19 pandemic, areas that should be addressed in the 2022 legislative session and other important matters. A total of 175 responses were received from the surveys mailed to households in House District 45.

In the following pages, there will be data that displays the range of important topics for ten questions that were asked in the survey. Following the data chart, there will be a pie chart that shows the percentage.

Methodology

Data was collected from survey responses that were returned via mail as well as an online version of the survey posted on RepMatsumoto.com. Online, an effort was made to collect survey responses from District 45 constituents only by asking survey respondents if they were District 45 constituents and asked them to select the zip code that applied.

Survey respondents who attempted to complete the survey online but were not constituents were directed to the Hawaii State Capitol website at <u>https://www.capitol.hawaii.gov/</u> to use the search box in the upper right-hand corner to find their legislators.


Note: The results reported can only be considered the opinions of the survey participants. They cannot be generalized to represent the entire client population as a whole.








Question 1: What are the top 5 areas that should be addressed in the 2022 legislative session for the State?
