### First Crossover



#### Aloha friends & neighbors!

March 5<sup>th</sup> is the first major legislative deadine. During First Crossover, all the bills that passed Third Reading in the House and Senate swap to the other chamber for comittee hearings and discussion. Only about 20% of the bills introduced make it this far, and some have changed since their original drafts.

## 2020 Bill Package Update

Two of the bills I introduced this session are still alive and moving onto the next step in the process:

#### **HB 2624 HD1 Environmental Impact Statement Website**

Creates the Environmental Impact Statement Hub Website as a central location for information about Environmental Impact Statements. The user-friendly website will include information about hearings, public comment periods, and allows comments to be submitted online. Creates transparency and ease-of-use in the EIS process.

#### HB 2064 HD1 On-site Childcare Facilities Tax Credit

Creates a tax credit for businesses with on-site childcare facilities to incentivize more childcare options. Studies demonstrate that additional childcare options help increase working women's earnings over time and increase employee statisfaction, morale, and retention.
