2020 Bill Package

Aloha friends & neighbors!

The 2020 Legislative session is now underway and I'm excited to share my bill package with you. This year's bill package is the result of the community's feedback to last month's issues survey. Thoughtful responses highlighted some of our community's biggest issues, including the high cost of living, environmental stewardship, and access to education.

Cost of Living

HB 1827: Expand Refundable Food/Excise Tax Credit

Increases the food/GET tax credit to \$330 for minimum wage earners and expands it up through middle income earners.

HB 2056: Earned Income Tax Credit

Makes the state earned income tax credit refundable and permanent.

HB 2239: Dependent Care Flexible Spending Accounts

Allows taxpayers to spend pre-tax dollars on dependent care expenses including daycare, after school programs, and in-home care, reducing total taxable income.

HB 2240: Income Tax Reduction

Eliminates the income tax for those earning minimum wage or less and reduces rates up through middle income earners.

HB 2241: Exempt Food, Medical Services, and Feminine Hygiene Products from the General Excise Tax (GET)

Makes food, medical services, and feminine hygiene products tax-free.

HB 2242: Child Tax Credit

Creates a tax credit for each taxpayer's dependent children, starting at \$500/child for minimum wage earners.

Education & Early Learning

HB 2064: Tax Credit for On-Site Childcare Facilities

Creates a tax credit for businesses with on-site childcare facilities.

HB 2623: Early Childhood Education Scholarships

Creates a scholarship program for UH early childhood education students who commit to teach three years in an EOEL classroom.

HB 2625: School Repair Subaccounts

Allocates dedicated funds each year to school principals for minor repair and maintenance projects that don't require a permit or EIS.

Environment

HB 2622: Airplane Pamphlet

Requires airlines to give a pamphlet to visitors with information about protected species, hiking & ocean safety, emergency contacts, and more. The pamphlet will be distributed alongside the agricultural declaration form.

HB 2624: Environmental Impact Statement Website

Creates a central, user-friendly website for state and county EIS hearings, notices, and reports.
