Waialua Town Hall Recap

Aloha friends & neighbors!

Thank you to those of you who attended this month's legislative town hall at Waialua Elementary School. Passionate and engaged community members like you are an integral part of our representative government. Many of the issues that were brought up, especially Dillingham Airfield and preserving agricultural lands, will require long-term investment and advocacy.

When it comes to the future of Dillingham Airfield, it's clear that there are still many unanswered questions about the best course of action to ensure commercial activities and public access can continue uninterrupted. Many questions raised at the town hall meeting about how Department of Transportation came to their decision, and even more questions about why nobody in the public, elected officials, or stakeolders were contacted about this decision that will affect the future of many in our community.

I recently signed a resolution along with Representative Sean Quinlan, in support of continuing operations at Dillingham Airfield and urging the Department of Transportation to work with the Federal Government and the U.S. Army to continue the State's lease of the airfield. My office is also working to ensure DOT, at a minimum,

delays the handover until after next legislative session so that the Legislature has a chance to find solutions for the long-term stability of airport operations.

My office, along with Senator Riviere, Representative Quinlan, and Councilmember Tsuneyoshi, is planning a follow-up town hall meeting to specifically discuss Dillingham Airfield. My office is working with Department of Transportation and the U.S. Army to ensure that they send representatives to field questions. Please call my office or visit www.
